To make everyone's life healthier, happier, longer, and safer.





 Licensure as an Environmental Health Specialist and five years of experience performing professional environmental health duties for a regulatory environmental health agency; OR

REQUIRED EXPERIENCE

- Two years of experience as an Environmental Health Specialist III in Nevada State service.
- Licensure as a Environmental Health Specialist and three years of experience performing professional environmental health duties for a regulatory environmental health agency; OR
- Two years of experience as an Environmental Health Specialist II in Nevada State service.
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university which includes the satisfactory completion of at least 45 quarter hours, or 30 semester hours, of academic work in science courses, including biology, chemistry, physics, geology, sanitary engineering or environmental engineering and one year of experience performing professional environmental health duties for a regulatory environmental health agency; OR
- One year of experience as an Environmental Health Specialist I in Nevada State service.
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university which includes the satisfactory completion of at least 45 quarter hours, or 30 semester hours, of academic work in science courses, including biology, chemistry, physics, geology, sanitary engineering or environmental engineering.
