#### **Nevada Health Care Workforce and Pipeline Development Workgroup**

#### Introduction

This Behavioral Health Workforce Development Asset Map documents behavioral health workforce development initiatives, programs, and resources throughout Nevada. It reflects the results of a 2022 statewide survey to identify existing workforce development efforts related to public health, behavioral health, and primary care, as well as additional research.

Assets are organized by stage of the workforce pipeline as shown in the table below: K-12, vocational training/higher education, and current workforce, and categorized by the type of service or program. For example, initiatives targeting young people in kindergarten through high school are included in the K-12 section, under categories related to career outreach and exploration, and academic success/college and career readiness.

#### **Nevada Health Care Workforce and Pipeline Development Workgroup**

The Nevada Health Care Workforce and Pipeline Development Workgroup aims to improve, grow, and diversify Nevada's public health, behavioral health, and primary care workforces and workforce pipelines to ensure the state has a workforce capable of meeting current and future health care needs.

It brings together stakeholders representing public health, behavioral health, primary care, traditional workforce development, K-12 and higher education, minority health and equity, and community-based organizations throughout the state to:

- 1. Enhance education and awareness of workforce development initiatives in Nevada, connect non-traditional partners, identify opportunities for cross-sector collaboration, and maximize resources statewide:
- 2. Identify and map workforce pipeline development initiatives in K-12 education, higher education, and the current workforce; and
- **3.** Create and implement workforce pipeline development plans for public health, behavioral health, and primary care.

DETR services are designed to address assessment, training, treatment, and job placement for Nevadans with disabilities. The Division places primary emphasis on providing necessary services to help clients work and live independently.
EmployNV www.employnv.gov	EmployNV is the state's largest database of job seekers, enabling established employers to post job openings and individuals to post resumes and search for opportunities. EmployNV offers various types of assistance to employers at no cost and can serve as an extension to a hiring department. It also serves as a statewide career hub, providing services to individuals at locations throughout the state or virtually, including assistance with resume and interviewing skills and financial assistance to those who need training.
Healthy Communities Coalition  healthycomm.org	Healthy Communities Coalition places Safe School Professionals, consisting of Community Health Workers, BSW, MSW and LCSW within schools to provide substance use prevention services, behavioral health and resources directly to students one on one or in group settings and provide supports to students at-risk of not graduating. HCC also provides a summer Comstock Youth Works program, recruiting 40 at-risk youth to engage in workforce development, substance use prevention education and enrichment activities, connecting each youth with an employer who also serves as a mentor. The youth are paid through HCC and on completion of the program, students earn one full credit toward graduation.
Nevadaworks nevadaworks.com	Nevadaworks is Northern Nevada's Local Workforce Development Board. It provides funding to qualified service providers who work directly with a diverse population of individuals who are seeking employment or skills upgrading, or who are entering the workforce for the first time.
PACT Coalition  drugfreelasvegas.org'	The PACT Coalition provides professional training, expands current certifications for existing professionals, and helps grow the field with bridged employees to other organizations that cannot provide support to expanded employee capacity.

The program is administered by the Nevada State Office of Rural Health in the Office of Statewide Initiatives, UNR School of Medicine.
OSIT Pennington Rural Health Services Loan Repayment Program  osit.nv.gov/Loan_Repayment/Loan_Repaymen t_Program/	This loan repayment program is available to certain health care professionals who engage in full-time clinical practice and reside in an assigned rural community in exchange for funding to repay qualified educational loans. Annual loan repayment ranges from \$10,000 to \$40,000 per year and requires a two- or three-year commitment.
