Introduction and Purpose

Various organizations, entities, and agencies throughout Nevada are engaged in workforce development. This work begins as introduction and outreach in elementary school, occurs through targeted programs in the K-12 system, expands through vocational training and higher education, and continues as opportunities for those in the workforce to gain skills and advance. However, much of it occurs in silos.

This Public Health Workforce Development Asset Map aims to document existing workforce development efforts related to public health to increase awareness of these initiatives, build on existing programs, and leverage existing resource to improve, grow, and diversify Nevada's public health workforce and pipeline.

Public health workforce development "assets" are organized by stage of the workforce pipeline and categorized by the type of service or program, as shown below.

Nevada Health Care Workforce and Pipeline Development Workgroup

The Nevada Health Care Workforce and Pipeline Development Workgroup aims to improve, grow, and diversify Nevada's public health, behavioral health, and primary care workforces and workforce pipelines to ensure the state has a workforce capable of meeting current and future health care needs.

It brings together stakeholders representing public health, behavioral health, primary care, traditional workforce development, K-12 and higher education, minority health and equity, and community-based organizations throughout the state to:

- Enhance education and awareness of workforce development initiatives in Nevada, connect nontraditional partners, identify opportunities for cross-sector collaboration, and maximize resources statewide;
- 2. Identify and map workforce pipeline development initiatives in K-12 education, higher education, and the current workforce; and
- 3. Create and implement workforce pipeline development plans for public health, behavioral health, and primary care.
